
English → Shape Poems and Calligrams, personal recounts and letter writing

Maths Challenge Week!

each day. We have explored maths this
week in the following ways; through art,

stories.

Science

In science this week we tested different materials to see whether they were waterproof. We learnt new words such as: absorbent, repel and waterproof.

Art

We have continued our print making unit this week. We have looked at layering, textures and have started to think about the effects we can create by making our own printing tool.

The children have had a lot of fun printing using recyclable and junk materials.

This week in Year Two!

English

In English, we used the I-pads to research our three chosen materials (wood, glass and plastic).

We then began to write our reports, organising our information into paragraphs under appropriate subheadings.

Maths

In Math's, we have been practicing our times table knowledge in order to support our work on multiplication!
We also used the 'doubling diamond' to double two digit numbers.

Science

In Science, we learned the word 'absorbent' and tested different materials in water.

We then wrote up on experiment and discussed vocabulary such as 'prediction' 'method' and 'results'

Art

This week in Art, we reflected on our topic and discussed what went well/ what we would change if we were to do it again. Children got to share and talk about the artwork they have completed this half term and it was great to see their successes!

Phonics home learning



Thank you to all those who attended the Early reading and Phonics parent meetings last term. If you were not able to attend, please do spend some time reading through the presentation sent out before the half term.

As mentioned during this session, children will be bringing home <u>2</u> different reading books each Friday afternoon.

One of them (story book) will be a book the child has read each day in class and feels confident and able to read. The other (a 'book bag' book) will be a similar story that is new to the child. They will also be bringing home their reading record.

We ask that you sign and date these reading records each time you read with your child –Leaving a comment to tell us how they did will also be very helpful.

In order for us to teach our lessons, **both of these books** <u>must</u> **be back in school each week on a Wednesday**. We ask for your support in ensuring your child is returning these books, in the condition they came home in, to school.
