Evidencing impact and accountability: 2023-2024

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Employment of Avanti Park staff in teaching 'high quality and outstanding' P.E lessons- Mrs M Watts plans and teaches Lower School PE lessons, Miss Bizazza teaches yoga as 1 hour of quality PE provision. Ms Cornish employed to teach KS3 P.E. SLT learning walks evidence effective teaching and learning.• The full rollout of the PE curriculum in 2024, that compliments the facilities, grounds, Avanti Ethos and National Curriculum requirements at Avanti Park school, especially at KS3 where swimming and dance is also introduced• The rollout of swimming provision at KS3 happened with yr 7 having swim lessons in Autumn 2023 to try to catch those who didn't meet KS2 curriculum requirements (eg swim 25m in a recognizable stroke etc..)• Inter – school competitions began for Primary- 1 year group per half term and were a great success.• Engagement of all pupils; the pupils at Avanti Park are all highly engaged and motivated by sport and physical education lessons with further fixtures, clubs and after school events happening (uch as boxing club, extension of ages to IG sports football club, fixtures at local schools and a KS2 cross country team.)• High Profile of PE & Sport – pupil achievements are displayed and celebrated weekly in Star of the week, as well as through house points and inter school competitions in KS3.• Olympic sports week introduced in June to further engage pupils in sport. Sporting clubs invited in for taster sessions and pupils were introduced to a further range of sports to try.• Two sports days from EYFS to year 8 continue to be honed and adapted. These celebrate sports and develop children's sportsmanship and competitive spirit: EYFS and KS1 Sports day for Reception to year 2 (in houses rotating 6 events on site, gaining points towards their house).	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Continue to foster links with local schools at KS3 to encourage further inter school competitions.• Hall floors need attention before line marking are added in 2024 to further enhance the teaching and learning of the PE curriculum from EYFS to year 8.• Continue to develop PE at Primary by adapting to 2 hours of quality PE lessons, absorbing yoga into these.
