

At Krishna Avanti Primary school, our behaviour system is

Croydon *Stay on Green*

We use colours to help children understand the choices they are making, each colour representing a clearly defined set of behaviours.

Every class has a *Stay on Green* display. At the start of each day all children begin with their name on the *Green* section.

Green means children are following the Golden Standards, being kind, respectful, honest, responsible, courageous, working hard and listening.

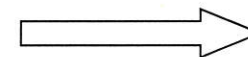
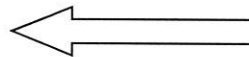
When children follow the Golden Standards, they *Stay on Green*

If they consistently make positive choices about their behaviour they may move to bronze, silver or gold.

If children make poor or inappropriate behaviour choices they move to blue, yellow, or even red.

Blue is the 'Thinking Zone'. If children go into the 'Thinking Zone' they have the opportunity to reflect on their behaviour and think about what they need to do to get back to *Green*.



This system is applied in lunchtime, dining hall, PE/sports gym, playgrounds, walking along in corridors, school visits and after school assemblies. CONSISTENCY in application is KEY even at home.

Between each stage, children are given time for reflection and the opportunity to change their behaviour.

GREEN BEHAVIOUR

- ✓ keeping the Golden Rules
- ✓ always trying my best
- ✓ listening well
- ✓ being honest and truthful
- ✓ being gentle – not being rough and hurting others
- ✓ being kind – saying and doing nice things

Rewards

Individual

The following colours show children that they are making the right choices:

Green: 1 point towards the class weekly total.

Bronze: Bronze reward - 2 points towards the class weekly total.

Silver: Silver reward - 3 points towards the class weekly total; note to parents/carers from the class teacher.

Gold: Gold reward announced in Celebration a fortnightly Assembly; 5 points towards the class weekly total; the child's name is recorded in the special **Gold Book**. (Three Gold awards in a term will earn an invitation to the Principal's **Golden Tea Party**)

Children who end every day on **Green** will receive a **Stay on Green Certificate** at the end of the half-term. If they have had more than three bronze rewards in the half term, they will receive a silver certificate at the end of the half term. If attained three silvers or more, they will receive a Gold Certificate. Three Golds or more will be awarded with a Platinum Certificate.

Other Rewards: stickers by class teachers, TAs& principal; attendance certificates, star of the week, where pupils have shown effort and determination in their work, regularly completing their work showing resilience in overcoming challenges.

This system is not about trying to be 'fair' and let everyone have a go at being **GOLD**. Being 'fair' is about helping everyone to **stay on Green**.

Whole class

Each class takes their weekly points total to Friday's celebration assembly. The class in each phase with the highest score will be awarded a **Stay on Green** to hang on their classroom door as well as thirty minutes of **Green Time** fun activities which they will plan with their teacher.

Consequences

All staff will support children to make good choices. Where poor choices are made, staff will encourage children to make better choices and acknowledge positive changes in attitude and behaviour as they occur.

The following colours are consequences:

Blue: First Verbal reminders / warning of how to **Stay on Green** is given Repeated misbehaviour will lead to time in the 'Thinking Zone' to reflect on behaviour.

Yellow: Further repeats=second warning/reminder again. Time out with either a reflection sheet or work to be completed in another class / alternative lunchtime provision.

Red: Third working reminder on the same day
2nd yellow card sent to the Deputy Head / Head Teacher.
3rd Yellow card behaviour on the same day will lead to Red card/Reporting slip/Senior staff may be involved along with parents/carers to discuss pupil behaviour.
If a child has 3 reporting slips in a half term, a letter will be sent home to parents/carers. For every 4th or subsequent reporting slip, the child will have an internal exclusion for the whole of lunchtime.
