School Stakeholders Committee (SSC)' Allowances and Code of Conduct

Purpose is to define circumstance under which the school will pay any claims made under School Stakeholders Committee's Allowance Policy

Payment of School Stakeholders Committee (SSC)' Allowances

The education (School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) Allowance) (England) regulations 2003 allows SSC members in maintained school with a delegated budget to choose whether to pay allowance or expenses to School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) and associate members of the School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) to cover cost such as child care, that they have incurred as a result of servicing as a SSC member. Where they choose to do so, it must be in accordance with our scheme.

As a matter of policy associate member or School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) servicing at KAPS will only be paid our allowance in a limited number of specific circumstances that are clearly in the best interests of the school or an academy.

These circumstances are defined below:

- Travel expenses to attend the School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) meeting. These will be the travel in actual expenditure incurred as public transport or mileage claim as per the school policy.
- Child Care cost for the child minding done by a responsible person who is paid for this purpose at a rate of £6.00 per hour.
- Care arrangement cost for a dependant at home at the rate of £8.50 per hour.
- Support for School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) with specific needs or disability to claim the proceedings during a School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) meeting.
- All expenses will be paid on provision of a receipt, at the rate set out in the policy, and be limited to the amount shown on the receipt.

School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) will not be paid for their role.

Paying School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) for their role as School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) is subject to very specific legal restrictions. There is no legal power for the school, LA or the government to pay members of the School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) for their duties as School Stakeholders Committee (SSC)

Multi Academy Trust, as independent charities must comply with Charity Law.

The appointed local School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) is not a charity in itself and their members are not usually trustees of the Multi Academy Trust. Even though the Charity law restriction on payment to trustees do not apply to member of the local School Stakeholders Committee (SSC) Avanti School's Trust expects voluntary service to remain normal practice for a member of the KAPS School Stakeholders Committee (SSC).
