This week's learning at KAPSC...

Year 1

We have been learning about prefixes and why they are important.



Reception

In Maths we have been learning about capacity and volume.

We have had an amazing final week of this half-term in Reception learning about the continent of Africa through listening to the story of Handa's Surprise.

The children got the opportunity to learn about different animal habitats e.g. the desert, savanna and the rainforest. They sorted African animals into herbivore, carnivore and omnivore groups. I was extremely impressed by some exceptional observational drawings of exotic fruits e.g. a pineapple, banana, avocado pear, orange and passion fruit. These fruits featured in the Handa story and the children showed their creativity to draw each fruit beautifully.

In Maths, we learnt about taking away and begun to record answers to our sums. We also began to learn our 2, 5 and 10 times table. Please encourage your child to practice at home.

In Science we have been learning about different habitats and we observed different minibeast very closely outside!



Year 2

This week in Year 2 we finished our topic Scientists and Inventors on a high! We spoke to and interviewed a real scientist. The children came up with fantastic questions like: What inspired you to become a scientist? When you invent something in a lab, do you work on 1 project at a time or multiple projects?

For English we explored the characters from Charlie and the Great Glass Elevator a bit more and looked at their emotions. We also created longer sentences using conjunctions to connect two clauses together.

I was amazed by the great and inventive toys for the future. All toys are on display now for the whole school to see: What a lot of potential scientists/inventors for the future!



Year 3

We had such an exciting week as our last week of the half term! We have put an end to our topic 'Footsteps from the past' by making fantastic dinosaur puppets and using them to bring our poems, written this half term, to life in a shadow puppet show! How exciting it was!

Also, we wrote excellent persuasive letters to the famous singer Adele to persuade her to support our playground upgrading project.

We have had a very creative week in Year 4! We completed our learning of Macbeth and publish our incredible extended pieces of writings such as our monologues, newspaper articles, poems and also our balanced arguments too! We then had a bit of a brainwave and decided to help the green initiative that our school is undertaking by writing to a homegrown rapstar - Stormzy!

We wrote some brilliant persuasive letters to Stormzy convincing him to support us in raising the profile of the school and our gardening project. We also rewrote one of his songs to be all about the importance of growing more plants!
