Science Material World: Properties and changes of materials

In this topic, the children learn about materials and how they change. First they test properties of materials before looking at how materials dissolve, what a solution is and evaporation. Finally, children compare reversible and irreversible changes.

Year 5 Autumn 1 **Curriculum Map Theme: The Anglo Saxons**

English

This half term for our English lessons we will be reading 'Freedom for Bron' as a class and discussing themes of Immigration, Cultural identity and our topic: The Anglo Saxons.

We will be responding to the text using reading vipers which will enhance our knowledge through exploring the vocabulary, using inference, make predictions, explain, retrieve and sequence or summarise.

We will be exploring narrative techniques and writing our own diary entries and stories.

Mathematics

We will be covering various units this half term which then will be covered in more detail in the next half term. These units will include Place Value, addition and subtraction and some Statistics.

Music

FOCUS: Rounds and Harmony. VOCAB: Harmony; round; chords; notation; intervals; major scale; phrasing

The children will learn how good harmonies are created, looking at chords and discord. They will learn songs that can be sung as rounds, and then transfer this learning to pitched instruments.

Philosophy, Religion and Ethics

Pupils will learn about the various creation stories from Hindu and History:

The Anglo-Saxons: Was the Anglo-Saxon period really a Dark Age? Britain's settlement by Anglo-Saxons and Scots

The children will learn about the world of the Anglo-Saxons. They will consider why they came to Britain and whether the period deserves to be called the 'Dark Ages'. Throughout the unit, there is a strong focus on the range of sources that provide us with evidence about the people living at that time.

This term, we will continue to use the CGP books and children are to complete two arithmetic and English workouts, one Maths and one spelling workout.
