


Classic & Modern Fiction





her network of criminals, forgers and snitches?





pirates. The Swallows and Amazons decide to battle it out, and so begins a summer of unforgettable discoveries and incredible adventures.





came to dragon training but after many hilarious mishaps, he soon got the hang of it and was on the way to becoming a Hero.







with comic pictures and his very own words, this test of Greg and Rowley's friendship unfolds with hilarious results.








Britain is a country rich with history, and this lift-the-flap book for older children covers life in Britain from Anglo-Saxon invasions to the 21st Century.





man from a crocodile!







He often immerses himself in a fantasy world where he and his sidekick, the Green Pig, save the universe from total disaster. However, real life is more challenging. He is anxious about getting things wrong at school, as he's ridiculed by his teacher and laughed at by his classmates. There is no respite at home, as his parents are

constantly arguing and his baby sister never stops crying. When he learns that a local park is to be demolished and replaced by a landscape of concrete and rubber, Timothy is devasted. Heknows he must try to save the park, and realises that real heroes stand up for what is right, even when the task seems impossibly daunting.



Claire: Justice Ninja intends to right the world of wrongs. Fed up with people spitting their gum out on the street? The corrupt politician paving over the playground? She really just wants to fit in and find a true friend, someone who appreciates her, Phonic Ear and all.



develops between them as Davey opens Sam's eyes to a whole new world: one that is alive with words, rhythm, music and colour, and the boys become Best Friends - but only in secret.


