# You Said, We Heard, We Did!



Where is my first point of call when seeking information? Tapestry or Google Classroom?

As a phase we are looking at various options to support our parents and ensuring that they have the relevant information at their finger tips. We are making a move towards the sole use of Google Classroom which would be aligned with the rest of the school. The platform is easy to use and if needed we will provide parental support.

What can we do about inconsiderate parking and can we work towards a zebra crossing?

We will task this to our Eco Committee to firstly gain the information they need to support a case for the council. Our first step is to educate our parent community in understanding the consequences to actions, such as inconsiderate driving and parking.

Communication from school to parents is really good, however we rarely are able to contact the school directly.

What provision is in place for a wrap around care service?

We have met a strong after school provider who will be able to meet the needs of our school. We are now waiting on their Ofsted check before we can share any further information, however we are certain all checks will pass and we will be able to share some good news on this.

Are there any plans to teach a Modern Foreign Language?

Yes, we are currently looking at providing Spanish for children in Year 3 to Year 6. We are hoping this will start in the autumn term.
