
# **ART WEEK 2022**

### ART AND THE ENVIRONMENT - Recycled Art

- The theme for this year's Art Week is Recycled Art.
- Every year group have learnt about <u>contemporary artists</u> who used their creativity to help the environment and to bring awareness about problems such as plastic pollution.
- Alongside their learning in class, children from Year 1 to Year 6 participated in Art Workshops led by professional artists and learnt about the painting style of a renowned Mexican artist, <u>Frida Khalo</u>. At the end of their learning sessions, they produced amazing individual artworks and a large piece of <u>collaborative</u> <u>painting</u>.

In their workshops this week, KS1 and KS2 learnt about **Frida Khalo** a very inspiring Artist who lived in Mexico.





Children linked this learning to Recycled Art Week by using fruit and vegetables as their inspiration source.

They also learnt how to draw a still life composition and landscapes using UV ink and paint markers.


"I liked painting with ink and meeting an illustrator." "I really liked painting with UV ink."


## **Statistics**

Year 3 to Year 6 (103 responses)


- 69% enjoyed art week very much (circled 5)
