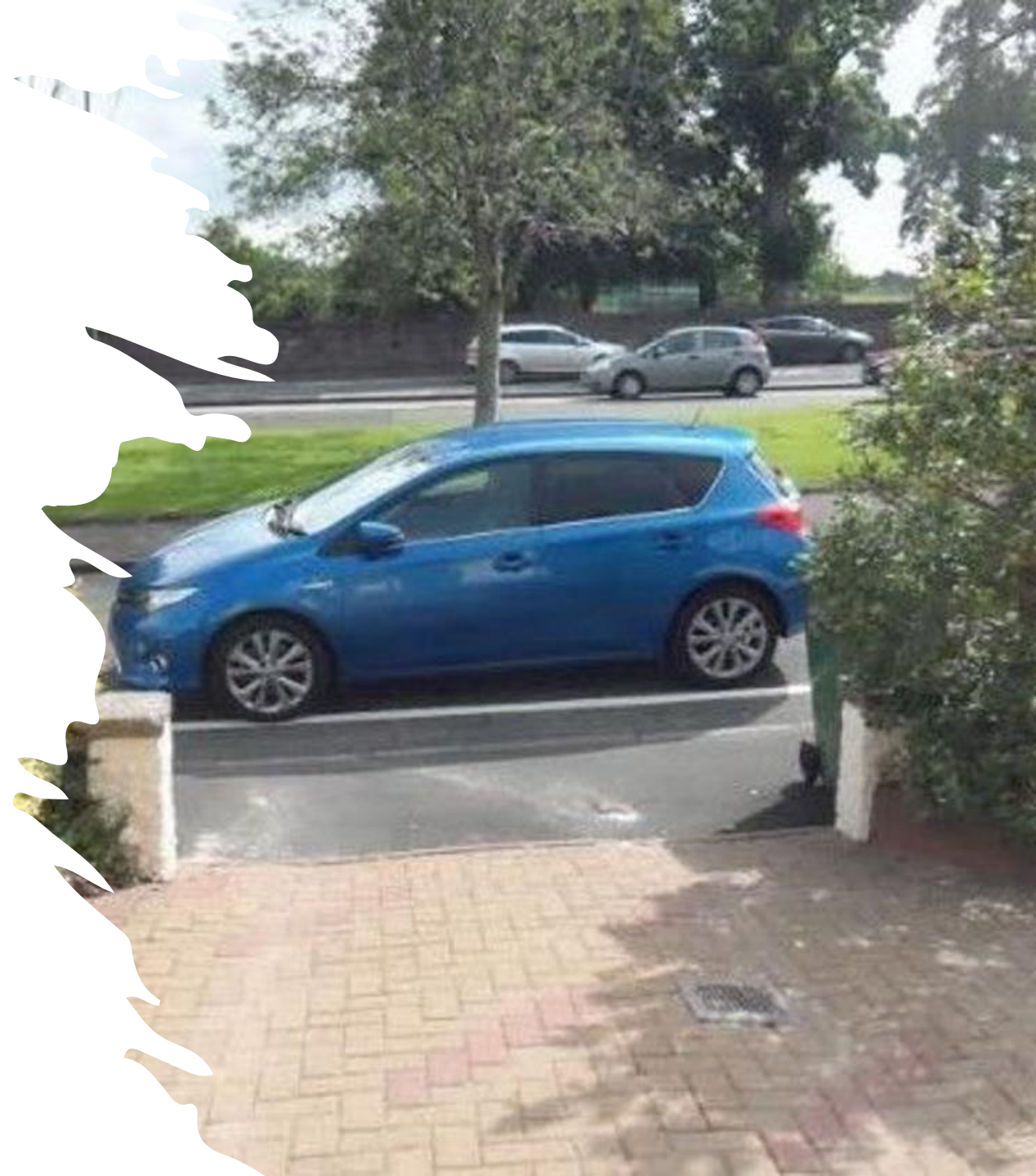
Diary dates for spring term have been shared with you, there is much to look forward to so please have a look and save the date for any presentations and/or events.
