Also starting in January 2020 is Pearl Barnes, our new Hub lead for SEND/ Safeguarding. has already met some parents and staff and will be working closely with Carolyn to further strengthen and develop systems, policies and procedures in all three schools.

School Improvement

Each principal has been asked to provide a revised development plan for the next two terms, plans that will focus on three main priorities:

- Improving the quality of leadership at all levels;
- Improving the quality of teaching, learning and assessment;
- Improving systems to help each school run more efficiently and effectively.

Once agreed, these revised plans will be published on each school's website.

Significant changes to each of the South West Avanti Schools

The Hub Board and the MAT Board have now formally considered the significant change proposals for each school following the period on consultation in October and November 2019. Whilst taking into account the representations made by parents their unanimous decision, based on the viability of each school and on projected need for secondary school places into the future, was to continue as planned and submit a formal business case to the Department for Education at the next possible opportunity. This is likely to be in January 2020, and if approved the changes - see below - will come into effect from September 2020 at the earliest.



AVANTI GARDENS

Avanti Gardens School significant change proposal: to change the age range at Avanti Gardens School (former Steiner Academy Bristol) from 4 to 16 to 4 to 11 with effect from September 2020. The capacity of the academy will change to 420 pupils (from the current 720). The Published Admission Number (PAN) will increase from 52 to 60.



Avanti Park School significant change proposal: to change the age range at Avanti Park School (former Steiner Academy Frome) from 3 to 16 to 3 to 13*. The school will then be re-designated as a middle (deemed primary) school from September 2020. The capacity of the academy will reduce to 540 pupils (from the current 720). The Published Admission Number (PAN) will increase from 52 to 60

*The current Year 10 (class 9) will continue to be educated at Avanti park until they complete their GCSE courses at the end of the summer term 2021.



Avanti Hall School significant change **proposal**: to extend the forms of entry into the secondary phase from the current two forms to three forms from September 2021 and to four forms of entry from 2023. The capacity of the academy will increase to 1020 pupils (from the current 720). The Published Admission Number (PAN) for the primary phase will increase from 52 to 60 in 2020 and in the secondary phase will increase to 90 from 2021 and then to 120 in 2023.
