



The Senior Physics Challenge for Year 12 students is an exciting opportunity for students to stretch their problem-solving skills and apply fundamental physical principles to novel situations. Year 12 Physics Students at Avanti House school competed in the Senior Physics Challenge in January 2023 and won 9 Silver and 21 Bronze Awards -- an incredible accomplishment for A-Level Physics.

Year 13 Physics student Anish Bakrania scooped the Top Gold Award in the British Physics Olympiad. The Avanti House School student is one of the country's top young physicists when it comes to problem solving. He has been invited to compete in the BAAO Competition and the BPhO Round 2 and will be invited to the parallel Oxford Training Camps. Following that, two teams of five students will be chosen to compete in the International Physics Olympiad in Japan and the IOAA in Poland in August. Furthermore, every student received an award ranging from Silver to Bronze, which is an incredible accomplishment for the Avanti House School Physics Department.

Gaura-Purnima is the full moon day on which Lord Chaitanya appeared on Earth. Avanti's spiritual ethos is based upon his teachings and so here is a little bit about this most incredible personality...

Lord Chaitanya was born in the year 1486 AD in Nadiya, then East India's epicentre for learning and scholarship. He was named Nimai (since he was born under a Neem tree) and was later given other names such as Visvambhara (one who maintains the universe) and finally Krishna Chaitanya. At an early age he founded what quickly became the region's foremost school, widely

renowned for its teaching in logic, grammar and rhetoric. He went on to lead an early civil disobedience movement, contesting religious sectarianism. In later life, he turned his attention to spiritual ideals that transcended social and religious boundaries and thus paved the way for a great spiritual renaissance.

He taught that the essence of education is to appreciate how everything has a special relationship with the divine. Such understanding culminates in a profound spiritual realisation of love, compassion and selflessness – the original, pure nature of every being.

During his life of 48 years, he spent approximately 24 years in the town of Jagannatha-puri, famous for its Krishna temple, which even to this day conducts the largest street procession in the world (Rathayatra), attracting millions of people – and which we replicate in our schools on a slightly smaller scale.

Historical records also evidence extraordinary philosophical and interfaith dialogues which in simple language explain the most profound truths.

He emphasised spiritual equality and advocated that humanity can be united through a shared love of God, expressed through the singing of God's many names.

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Chaitanya's exemplary life heralded the dawn of an inclusive spiritual resurgence that continues to inspire people all around the world.




What drives you?

Avanti and Teach First – an exciting new collaboration!

Avanti Schools Trust is proud to announce a partnership with Teach First, one of the leading providers of outstanding teacher training in the country. This allows us to offer the School-Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT) route into teaching from September 2023.

This is our first collaboration with Teach First hence the excitement! Salina Ventress, our School Improvement Lead stated, "This programme allows graduates, or those wishing to switch careers, to learn in a 'hands-on' capacity from the best mentors in inspiring environments within our flourishing schools."



With SCITT, individuals will learn the theory of teaching through online and inperson training. Over the course of 12 months, learning is put into practice by teaching in our Harrow and Leicester based schools – all of which have been rated as 'good' by Ofsted. In essence, this could be the best route into teaching for some individuals, as it offers an opportunity to gain Qualified Teacher Status and a PGCE over the course of one year.

We will be offering this unique programme for Primary and Secondary trainee teaching posts; there is some financial support available depending on the phase and subject area. Applicants must have a degree in a relevant subject area, and GCSE or equivalent qualifications in English and maths.
