



In 2019, Avanti Schools Trust was selected by Hertfordshire County Council to open a "Learning Village" in Bishops Stortford. The Learning Village will comprise of two primary schools and one secondary school. Avanti Meadows will be the first of the three schools to

open. With the national vaccination drive, Avanti is working with Hertfordshire County Council and the NHS to allow the school building to be used as a mass vaccination centre. More than 4,000 people have been vaccinated in the Stortford area so far.



The growing Sixth form has seen its first set of students successfully complete the prestigious Cambridge A Level in Hinduism. Students completed the course in November and were eagerly awaiting the outcomes this week. We are incredibly proud to announce that 100% of students gained A/A* with two students gaining the very top awards. We are also in the fortunate position to announce our first students to receive offers to study at Oxford & Cambridge Universities.

They have gained places to study Philosophy, Politics and Economics (PPE) and Theology. This first cohort of successful students will blaze a path for future Avanti Sixth formers and to create a link that will benefit all students, whatever year group they are in. We value all students' next steps in education or employment but it is certainly encouraging to know that we can create the opportunity to compete with the very best scholars in the world.



The staff at Avanti Park made a fantastic effort for 'Christmas Jumper day'. Over £150 was raised for Save the Children, a charity which improves the lives of children through better education, health care, and economic opportunities, as well as providing emergency aid in natural disasters, war, and other conflicts.




